

Legacy Connector Construction Update July 27, 2023

Site prep continues for the Legacy Connector project and Harper General Contractors has reported that 95% of the tree clearing has been completed. In the upcoming days, additional tree protection fencing will be put into place.

Safety is a top concern for the project, and Harper has led several safety training sessions to ensure all vendors on site understand and follow safety protocol. We continue to ask for the public's support by remaining out of the construction zone during this critical time of site development. Construction Activities Anticipated Prior to Our Next Update

During the next 3-4 weeks, the crew will wrap up Tree Clearing and concentrate on Earthwork. Stone will begin to arrive in preparation for the Asphalt Binder, and the team will also begin to prep for Pile Mobilization. The traffic pattern for construction work is directed for Algonquin Trail—to/from the traffic circle on Rocky Slope to the Legacy Connector Construction entrance. The City of Greenville's active construction project on Algonquin is challenging access, but the team is working diligently to coordinate with the City Crew to maintain an open lane of travel. If residents could use another point of entry/exit from Belhaven Village to avoid the congested area, we would greatly appreciate your assistance. **Construction Schedule (Update):** Construction is underway with completion expected by the end of December 2023.
